

Academy of Patient Organisations (Akademie pacientských organizací - APO)

The Academy of Patient Organisations is an educational platform operated by the Association of Innovative Pharmaceutical Industry (AIFP) for representatives of Czech patient organisations.

During 2023: GSK supported the APO with a gift of CZK 66,000 designated for the preparation and implementation of activities related to the educational and networking platform "Academy of Patient Organisations (APO)". Our supported equalled 4.9% of the APO's annual income.

During 2022: GSK provided CZK 50,000 of funding to support the preparation and implementation of activities of the educational and networking platform "Academy of Patient Organisations (APO)". Our support represented 2.5% of their overall income in 2022.

During 2021: GSK provided CZK 38,000 of funding to support the preparation and implementation activities of the educational and networking platform "Academy of Patient Organisations (APO)". Our support represented 2.3% of their overall income in 2021.

Aliance žen s rakovinou prsu, o.p.s. – projekt Bellis (Mladé ženy s rakovinou prsu)

Alliance of Women with Breast Cancer is a patient organisation with a focus on breast cancer prevention. It serves as an information and educational centre for the public, cancer patients and their organisations. It also provides methodological support to cancer care organisations and prepares projects and campaigns related to breast cancer prevention and treatment.

During 2022: GSK provided CZK 50,000 of funding to support a reprint of the educational book "You are not alone". Our support represented 0.7% of their overall income in 2022.

During 2020: GSK provided CZK 100,000 of funding to support a publication for patients. Our support represented 5% of their overall income in 2020.

We have supported this group since 2020.



Czech AIDS Help Society (Česká společnost AIDS pomoc, z.s.)

The Czech AIDS Help Society was established in 1989 as an initiative of PLWHIVs' loved ones, friends and families with the goal of supporting PLWHIV in addressing everyday complications that HIV brings. The patient organisation focuses on disease prevention and outreach. The organisation operates the social asylum centre House of Light (Dům světla).

During 2023: In 2023, we supported the patient organisation with a gift of CZK 400,000. The project goal was to support outreach and low-threshold HIV screening activities. The organisation carries out HIV testing at ČSAP checkpoints in the Czech Republic and in testing ambulances. Our support equalled 1.2% of the organisation's annual income.

During 2022: GSK provided CZK 630,000 of funding to support:

- The establishment of HIV test centres (checkpoints) in Pilsen and Liberec (CZK 80,000);
- Free anonymous HIV testing in checkpoints in the Czech Republic as well as mobile testing (CZK 350,000);
- The costs associated with the provision of urgent treatment for HIV positive persons of Ukrainian nationality who fled from Ukraine to the Czech Republic (two gifts of CZK 100,000 each).

GSK also supported the treatment of HIV positive refugees from Ukraine through the donation of a medicinal product to the Bulovka University Hospital. This assistance was coordinated with the Czech Society AIDS Help. Our support represented 1% of their overall income in 2022.

During 2021: GSK provided CZK 350,000 of funding to support patient testing. The project's main objective is to support operation of "checkpoints" – testing points by the Czech AIDS Help Society in nine towns in the Czech Republic and four mobile ambulances in the times of the COVID-19 pandemic. Our support represented 1.6% of their overall income in 2021.

During 2020: GSK provided CZK 280,000 of funding to support patient testing (CZK 250,000) and patients with COVID-19 (CZK 30,000). Our support represented 5% of their overall income in 2020.

GSK Czech Republic supports this organisation since 2018.

The Voice of Cancer Patients (Hlas onkologických pacientů, z.s.)

The Voice of Cancer Patients is a non-governmental, non-profit organisation (patient and supportive organisation) that focuses on fulfilling the health care, social and psychological needs of cancer patients and their loved ones. The association's mission is to work, in particular, on tasks related to the representation and advocacy of the interests of patients with oncological and haemato-oncological diagnoses, in order to comprehensively meet their needs.

During 2023: GSK gave a gift of CZK 89,500 for the project "The patient's journey" (Cesta pacienta), i.e. setting up optimal patient journeys through specific diagnoses across the Czech health care system. The project objective is to detect weak spots on this journey throughout the Czech Republic. Our support equalled 8.89% of the organisation's annual income.



Multiple Myeloma Patients Club (Klub pacientů mnohočetný myelom, z.s.)

The Club is a non-governmental, non-profit organisation founded in March 2007. Its mission is to offer quality and comprehensive information to patients with a rare disease – multiple myeloma – and their loved ones, to facilitate meetings between patients and experts from various fields, and to help patients navigate difficult situations in life.

During 2023: GSK supported the Club with a gift of CZK 110,000 for a special exercise class for MM patients as well as a gift of CZK 100,000 for an educational seminar for MM patients and their families and friends and publication of a Bulletin for patients and their loved ones. Our support equalled 19.2% of the organisation's annual income.

During 2022: GSK provided CZK 107,180 of funding to support the organisation of an educational seminar about stress reduction training. Our support represented 8.8% of their overall income in 2022.

No Foot No Stress, o.s.

This patient organisation focuses on prevention of meningitis and support to patients who have survived meningitis.

During 2023: GSK supported the organisation with a gift of CZK 250,000 to cover the costs of the event "For the Health of Children and Adults" (Za zdraví dětí a dospělých) – Run4help which took place on 17 July, 2023. Proceeds from the charity event were credited to a transparent account and used to purchase sports prosthetic devices for amputees. Our support equalled 22% of the organisation's annual income.

During 2022: GSK provided CZK 250,000 of funding to support to cover the costs of the "For the Health of Children and Adults" event held on 11 June 2022. The proceeds of the charitable event were credited to a transparent account from which sports prostheses for people with an amputation were funded. Our support represented 22 % of their overall income in 2022.

During 2021: GSK provided CZK 320,000 of funding to support the organisation of two awareness-raising running races (Run4Help on 12 June 2021 and Rudolfinum Run on 18 December 2021) whose aim was to raise awareness of meningitis and its prevention. Our support represented 22% of their overall income in 2021.

During 2020: GSK provided CZK 250,000 of funding to support a meningitis awareness campaign. Our support represented 7% of their overall income in 2020.

GSK Czech Republic supports this organisation since 2018.



Pleasure without Risk (Rozkoš bez rizika, z.s.)

Pleasure without Risk is a non-governmental, non-profit organisation established in 1992. Its mission is to improve the status of female and male sex workers and to prevent and decrease risks related to sex work.

During 2023: GSK supported the organisation with a donation of CZK 100,000 to purchase HIV tests for sex workers. Our support equalled 0.27% of the organisation's annual income.

During 2022: GSK provided CZK 100,000 of funding to support the purchase of HIV tests. Our support represented 0.47% of their overall income in 2022.

GSK Czech Republic supports this organisation since 2022.

Veronica, z.ú.

The patient organisation Veronica brings together patients with endometrial, vulvar, ovarian and cervical cancer and women with BRCA 1 and BRCA 2 genetic mutations.

During 2023: GSK supported the organisation with a gift of CZK 140,000 for an annual oncogynaecology campaign culminating on 20 September and a gift of CZK 50,000 for preparation of four patient education videos. Our support equalled 15,4 % of the organisation's annual income.

During 2022: GSK provided CZK 110,000 of funding to support the preparation and printing of an educational brochure about oncogynecological diseases for the GO DAY outreach campaign (which culminated on 20 September 2022 with a purple bike ride through Prague) and for an educational campaign about ovarian cancer. Our support represented 13% of their overall income in 2022.

During 2021: GSK provided CZK 80,000 of funding to support the development of the GO DAY campaign on 20 September 2021 – a disease awareness campaign focused on cervical carcinoma, and an autumn campaign dedicated to ovarian carcinoma and its current treatment. Our support represented 22.5% of their overall income in 2021.

During 2020: GSK provided CZK 50,000 of funding to support the maintenance of their webpage. Our support represented 3% of their overall income in 2020.



Spolek Alergo rodičů alergických a astmatických dětí

This organisation assists parents of children with asthma by sharing advice and recommendations related to asthma and allergy treatment.

During 2023: GSK supported the Alergo association with a gift of CZK 15,000 designated for organisation of a summer camp for 28 children. Thus, children with asthma and cystic fibrosis were able to spend a part of their summer vacation under medical supervision. Our support equalled 8.5% of the organisation's annual income.

During 2022: GSK provided CZK 15,000 of funding to support the organisation of a summer climate camp for 31 children. Children with asthma and cystic fibrosis thus spent part of their summer holidays under medical supervision. Our support represented 8.33% of their overall income in 2022.

During 2021: GSK provided CZK 10,000 of funding to support a summer climate camp for 32 children. Children with asthma and cystic fibrosis thus spent part of their summer holidays under medical supervision. Our support represented 6.33% of their overall income in 2021.

We have supported this group since 2021.
