Our 20% reinvestment programme



Millions of people in the world's poorest countries do not have access to basic healthcare

One of the biggest barriers to accessing healthcare is a chronic shortage of health workers, particularly in remote communities, where the nearest health facility could be hours or days away



Partnership is key







The strength of the programme comes from the local expertise of the three NGO partners who work with governments to address healthcare priorities

Supporting the training of frontline health workers is our primary focus



Since 2009 **£21 million** has been reinvested to improve access to healthcare

This has helped train 40,000 health workers





We reinvest 20% of profits made in Least Developed Countries back into strengthening those countries' healthcare systems



Our focus is on training frontline health workers who can help to reduce child and maternal mortality aswell as meet wider community health needs

Our sustainable approach



Builds local capabilities enabling improved delivery of health services e.g. by developing learning programs and on-line training

Works with governments on the benefits of greater investment in healthcare systems
